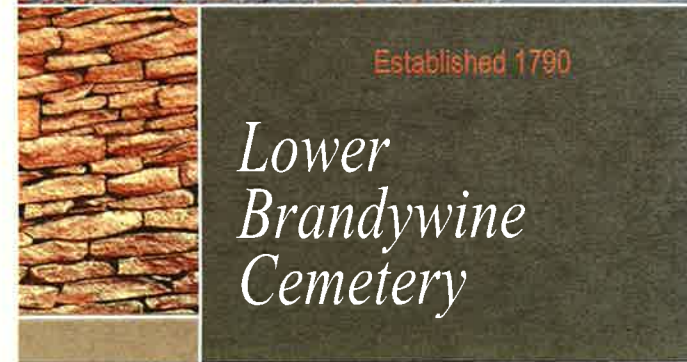

. . . the beautiful rolling hills of the historic Brandywine River Valley of northern Delaware and Southern Pennsylvania. Located next to the Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church, established in 1790, the cemetery offers a peaceful setting for interment and has been serving families for 200 plus years.

Historic

Still bordered on all three sides by the original colonial roads, the church cemetery captures one's imagination of those who may have traveled through this very parcel of land over the past 200 years. Ranging from horses - drawn carriages traveling up and down Delaware's first "National Scenic Byway" to lavish events at A.I. DuPont's Winterthur estate across the road, the church and cemetery have been part of an era that remains ever present today. The church dates back to 1720 - 56 years before the American Revolution.

It is in sharing this history with the congregation and community that the Lower Brandywine Church and Cemetery takes great pride.

Serenity

Lower Brandywine Cemetery's natural beauty with mature trees and rolling becomes even more enhanced as the seasons change, thus providing a tranquil and serene setting perfect for the interment of a family member, reflection, or visiting a loved one's final resting place. Care is taken to insure each plot and

Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church

One of the oldest churches in America and the oldest in Delaware, the Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church was originally established on land deeded by King George I in 1790 on land that was then "the County of Chester, in the Providence of Pennsylvania," 56 years before the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The original building was log construction which was later renovated to include new exterior clap boards and plastered interior making it more comfortable and inviting. The present church was built in 1860 using some materials from the original structure and over the years has grown in size along with the congregation into a place of worship rich in history, fellowship, and community.
